## **UKHSA** publishes travel-associated infections report

Case numbers of selected travel-associated infections reported in England, Wales and Northern Ireland: January to June 2025

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) have <u>published their latest report</u> summarising case numbers of selected travel-associated infections reported in England, Wales and Northern Ireland (EWNI) [1].

The current report includes detailed information on the trends of <u>chikungunya</u>, <u>cholera</u>, <u>dengue</u>, rickettsial infections and <u>Zika virus disease</u> between January and June 2025. An infection summary and key findings are provided for <u>Japanese encephalitis</u>, <u>Oropouche virus disease</u>and <u>yellow fever</u> [1].

The report showed [1]:

- An increase in chikungunya with a total of 73 cases reported between January and June 2025 compared with 27 cases for the same period in 2024.
- Oropouche virus disease was reported for the first time in EWNI. The three imported cases were all linked to travel to Brazil.
- Reports of dengue and Zika virus disease in EWNI were lower in the first six months of 2025 compared with the same period in 2024.
- Eight travel-associated cholera cases were reported, compared with one case for the same period in 2024.
